What are you doing to challenge yourself spiritually this year? I haven't really said much about our annual Bible reading challenge. I haven't really said much about Sunday School or worship service attendance lately. It seems these activities are the defaults. ### Youth Minister's Post

Do you know what the Greek word for baptize is? The word is baptizó. Baptizó means I dip, submerge, but specifically of ceremonial dipping; I baptize. *Baptizó* implies submersion (IMMERSION) in contrast to sprinkle. In Mark 1:4-5;8 is says, "John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And all the country of Judea was going out to him, and all the people of Jerusalem; and they were being BAPTIZED by him in the Jordan River, confessing their sins. I baptize you with water; but He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." John was "immersing" people in the Jordan River after they had confessed their sins. Later on in chapter 1 John the Baptist baptized Jesus in the Jordan River. "In those days Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was BAPTIZED by John in the Jordan. Immediately coming up out of the water, He saw the heavens opening and the Spirit like a dove descending upon Him." Did you catch what verse 10 said, "Immediately coming UP OUT of the WATER." Jesus was submerged under the water because He CAME UP OUT OF THE WATER. Baptism can be a tough subject to understand. If you ever any questions about baptism feel free to talk to Jack or I about it. We would love to help you understand what it means to be baptized and the significance behind it!
