"And Jesus kept increasing in wisdom and **stature**, and in favor with God and men." Luke 2:52 (NASB)

"Jesus kept increasing in stature" ... Shepherds saw a newborn Savior. The Maji saw a toddler King of the Jews. Teachers at the temple saw a 12 year old boy. Luke says Jesus grew physically. The next time we read of Jesus, he us a matured man.

As we grow in spiritual service and in spiritual stability, we increase in spiritual stature.
