Dear Ones,

The local paper called it a "flash drought." The ground saturated with moisture from spring rains is now dry and cracked. Combining some very warm temperatures with some very dry weeks, our crops are stressed and may not produce as we would like. I am starting to learn the significance of the weather on our local and regional economy.

I am thinking today about a spiritual application to our 'flash drought." The first of the Psalms pictures a tree planted by streams of water. (Psalm 1:3) The tree is fruitful, full of leaves because it's roots are watered and nourished by the stream. The Psalmist says that describes the person who "delights in the law of the Lord."

Psalm 42 pictures a deer finding refreshment in the cool water of a stream. The Psalmist says his heart pants for the Lord in the same way a deer seeks out that satisfying drink at the brook. It is apparent to me, that if we want to stay spiritually refreshed, we need to be drinking regularly from the stream.

Does this spiritual stream that nourishes and refreshes ever dry up? I really do not think so. I tend to think we have a tendency to allow other pursuits and activities keep us from sinking our spiritual roots deeply into the nourishing Word of God. We may think we can find satisfaction in life and quench our thirst in other ways. When we turn away from the water of life (read John 4:7 -15), we will find ourselves heading toward a "flash drought." The good news is, just as a refreshing rain can break a drought, you can come to the stream and find an abundant supply to refresh and renew our spirits. 
